conversation, grounding, mindfulness, play therapy, bilateral stimulation, learning techniques for managing stressors in real time, exposure, reframing using the metaphors of nature.

- . Just walking and talking
- . Individual pursuit (e.g. forest therapy)
- . Programmes (e.g. equine or wilderness)

Danger of pantheism
Danger of panentheism
Danger of idolatry
Danger of cultural bias
Danger of over-exercising
Danger of uncontained chaotic behaviour

- . Creation given the place it is designed for
- . Turning to the Lord together
- . Surrounded by many reasons to praise
